# #1 AZ COMPASS PREP (AZ)

SC NEXT #1 25-2 CHANDLER, AZ

## KNOW THE PERSONNEL

The Dragons (25-2) are a well-balanced, gritty group who tactically dismantle the opposition with balance on both ends of the floor. Kaden and Kalek House are a dynamic twin tandem for the Dragons who hurt defenses in numerous ways on both ends of the floor. Kaden, a 6-3 Maryland signee, led the Dragons with 16 points a game in Nike EYBL Scholastic play, and Kalek, a 6-3 Xavier signee, pumped in 14 points a game in league play. Kalek shot 41.2 percent from three this season while the duo posted 4.6 steals a game. Demarcus Henry, a 6-7 wing who is ranked No. 10 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2027, fills up the stat sheet and serves as the roster's mismatch player who can expose defenses on the offensive end. Henry also leads the Dragons in rebounding at 8.4 a game. Quincy Wadley, who is ranked No. 57 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2026, gives the Dragons another athletic scorer in the backcourt and a capable on-ball defender.

## ROAD TO CHIPOTLE NATIONALS

The Dragons finished No. 1 in the EYBL Scholastic West Division this season and reeled off multiple ranked wins, including four wins over teams ranked in the top 10 of the SCNext Top 25. AZ Compass had key wins over powerhouses Sunrise Christian (Kan.), Brewster Academy (N.H.), Bella Vista (Ariz.), Link Academy (Mo.) and Wasatch Academy (Utah), among others. The Dragons ranked No. 4 in scoring defense in the EYBL Scholastic this season and No. 1 in steals, swiping 9.31 a game.

## 2 DYNAMIC PREP (TX)

SC NEXT #4 16-1 DALLAS, TX

### KNOW THE PERSONNEL

Dynamic Prep (16-1) implores a tenacious style of play, using their plethora of talented athletes to impact the game on both ends of the floor. Dynamic's talented backcourt centers around DaKari Spear, a 6-4 shooting guard who is signed to Texas Tech. Spear's motor remains in overdrive and he scores in a variety of different ways. Austin Goosby, a 6-4 shooting guard who is signed to Texas, is the ultimate two-way guard, imploring versatile scoring on the offensive end while locking up on the defensive end. Dynamic also boasts the top ranked junior in the SCNext 100, Marcus Spears Jr.. Spears, a 6-10 forward plays above the rim, using his elite athleticism to overwhelm opposing bigs. His ability to patrol the paint and finish plays gives Dynamic an extra gear.

### ROAD TO CHIPOTLE NATIONALS

Dynamic finished as runner-up last year at Chipotle Nationals but feel they have run the gauntlet during the regular season to help them get over the hump this year. Dynamic, which is coached by six-time NBA All-Star Jermaine O'Neal, finished the season ranked No. 6 overall in the SCNext Top 25 pulling out wins over some of the top teams like Pace Academy (Ga.), Columbus (Fla.), Wasatch Academy (Utah), Montverde Academy (Fla.), Prolific Prep (Fla.) and Dream City Christian (Ariz.), among others.

SC NEXT #9 23-4 PHOENIX, AZ

### KNOW THE PERSONNEL



The Bears (23-4) are a scrappy, talented group of athletes who are relentless on both ends of the floor. The Bears boast the EYBL Scholastic Player of the Year in West Virginia signee Miles Sadler, who is ranked No. 27 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2026. The 6-0 point guard pumped in 19.4 points, 5.7 assists and 2.1 steals a game in EYBL Scholastic play this season. Sadler posted 24 points, seven rebounds and seven assists to lead the Bears to the EYBL Scholastic Tournament title. Paul Osaruyi, a 6-8 forward who is ranked No. 3 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2027, is a stat sheet filler, impacting the game on both ends of the floor and serving as a matchup nightmare for immobile big men. Vaughn Karvala provides versatility on the wing for the Bears, scoring in a variety of different ways and creating for his teammates. Karvala, an Indiana signee, is ranked No. 41 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2026.

### ROAD TO CHIPOTLE NATIONALS

The Bears took home the EYBL Scholastic Conference Tournament title, pulling out a 69-65 win over AZ Compass Prep. This season, Bella Vista ducked no competition, playing one of the most brutal schedules in the country and pulling out massive wins over top teams like Dynamic Prep (Texas), SPIRE Academy (Ohio), Faith Family (Texas), Sunrise Christian (Kan.) and IMG Academy (Fla.), among others. The Bears were the top scoring team in the EYBL Scholastic this season, averaging 70.3 points a game. They finished second in rebounding (33.9 a game) and first in blocked shots (4.67 a game).

## 4 PROLIFIC PREP (FL)

SC NEXT #4 37-3 FT. LAUDERDALE, FL

### KNOW THE PERSONNEL

The Crew (37-3) comes in swarms to dismantle teams on both ends of the floor and uses their talent and depth as the springboard. Everything starts with Caleb Holt for Prolific Prep. The 6-5 guard is ranked No. 4 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2026 and is committed to Arizona. He's a relentless competitor who scores in every way imaginable and still manages to keep his teammates involved and engaged in the offensive flow. Holt averaged 22 points a game for the Crew this season. Bruce Branch, a 6-7 wing who is ranked No. 6 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2026, is a walking matchup problem because of his versatility. The BYU commit averaged 18 points a game. Nasir Anderson, a 6-2 point guard who is ranked No. 6 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2027, runs the show for the Crew. He doubles as a capable scorer who averaged 13 points a game, and Alex Smith, a 6-7 forward who averaged 12 points a game, is the Crew's best deep threat.

### ROAD TO CHIPOTLE NATIONALS

Prolific Prep prepared for Chipotle Nationals by playing one of the most brutal schedules in the country and finishing the season ranked No. 4 overall in the SCNext Top 25. The Crew racked up key wins over teams like Southeastern Prep (Fla.) twice, Paul VI (Va.), Bella Vista (Ariz.), IMG Academy (Fla.) and St. John's Boco (Calif.), among others. Two of the keys to the Crew's game plan is their ability to hit the offensive glass and defend. This season they racked up 13 offensive boards a game and have held opponents to just under 50 points a game.

## KNOW THE PERSONNEL

The Eagles (21-6) thrived under first-year head coach Steve Turner, closing out the EYBL Scholastic regular season with a win over Tennessee Collegiate to clinch the East Division title. They're led by Dhani Miller, a 6-3 scoring guard who averaged 15.5 points and seven rebounds a game in league play. Lincoln Cosby, a 6-10 forward who is committed to Michigan, gives them versatility in the post and on the wing as does 6-10 forward Joe Philon, a UCLA commit. Javion Tyndale, a 5-9 point guard is the engine that makes the Eagles go, orchestrating the offense and dictating the flow on both ends of the floor. Tyndale led the EYBL Scholastic in assists, dishing out 5.7 a game.

## ROAD TO CHIPOTLE NATIONALS

The Eagles finished the season ranked No. 3 overall in the SCNext Top 25 by mowing down steep competition all year. The Eagles knocked off top schools like Prolific Prep (Fla.), Archbishop Stepinac (N.Y.), IMG Academy (Fla.), SPIRE Academy (Ohio) and Brewster Academy (N.H.), among others. Montverde had the No. 2 offense in the EYBL Scholastic this season, averaging 69.3 points a game. They finished second in the league in blocked shots, swatting 4.6 a game, and fourth in rebounds with 32.5 a game.

SC NEXT #8 33-2 CHANTILLY, VA

### KNOW THE PERSONNEL

The Panthers (33-2) boast arguably the most talented player at Chipotle Nationals in Jordan Smith, a 6-2 scoring guard who is ranked No. 2 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2026. Smith, an Arkansas signee, is a walking bucket, scoring in every imaginable way using his elite athleticism to get to his spots on the court. Smith leads the Panthers, averaging 26.7 points a game. Brian Mitchell Jr., a 6-4 shooting guard, adds firepower for the Panthers, averaging 12.6 points a game. Lawrence Brown III, a 6-1 point guard who is signed to Florida Gulf Coast, is a consistent floor general who ignites the offense and still manages to pump in 10.2 points a game and Dylan Harsanyi, a 6-3 shooting guard, is a marksman from three. The Panthers have a relentless style, trapping and applying pressure everywhere on the defensive end while moving the ball around on the offensive end and launching threes in abundance.

### ROAD TO CHIPOTLE NATIONALS

Paul VI finished the season ranked No. 8 overall in the SCNext Top 25 after racking up key wins over some of the country's top teams like Calvary Christian (Fla.), Bartlett (Tenn.) and three times over St. John's College High (Washington, D.C.), among many others. The Panthers feature a high-octane offense and they aren't shy when it comes to hoisting and draining 3-pointers, connecting on 40 percent of their threes this season.

## KNOW THE PERSONNEL

The Tigers (24-6) have a plethora of scoring guards capable of posting big numbers on any given night. Mariano Manciel, a 6-3 shooting guard, is a sniper from deep who doubles as a playmaker that can get to the basket against the stingiest of defenses. He's joined in the backcourt by Junior County, a 6-4 coring guard who is signed to Connecticut and is ranked No. 43 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2026. County thrives as a high-level scorer who creates off the dribble with his high motor and proved to be one of the best rebounding guards in the EYBL Scholastic, averaging 5.6 a game. Katrell Harmon, a 6-5 scoring guard who is signed to Creighton, brings versatility and size on both ends of the floor.

## ROAD TO CHIPOTLE NATIONALS

The Tigers finished the season ranked No. 7 overall in the SCNext Top 25 and had their fair share of marquee wins throughout the season. Wasatch took down teams like Montverde Academy (Fla.), Bella Vista (Ariz.), IMG Academy (Fla.), Brewster Academy (N.H.) and Faith Family Academy (Texas), among others. The Tigers had to top scoring defense in the EYBL Scholastic this season, spotting teams just 55.4 points a game. ### KNOW THE PERSONNEL

SPIRE (27-2) takes on the intense nature of its first-year head coach Kevin Boyle in its attack. Their collection of length and athleticism gives them an edge on both ends of the floor and has propelled them all season. SPIRE's catalyst is King Gibson, a 6-5 point guard who is ranked No. 11 in the SCNext 100 for 2027. Gibson is a feisty competitor who creates scoring opportunities for himself and his teammates and keeps the defense off balance with his versatility. He averaged 15 points a game in EYBL Scholastic play this season. He's joined in the backcourt by 5-10 point guard Darrell Davis, a quick and heady scorer. Tarris Bouie, a 6-6 wing who is ranked No. 33 overall in the SCNext 100 for 2026, gives SPIRE length and athleticism on the perimeter. He's a capable defender who guards all five positions and scores in a variety of different ways. Alex Constanza, a 6-8 wing who is signed to Georgetown, gives SPIRE depth and versatility on the perimeter as does Aiden Derkack, a 6-6 shooting guard who is committed to Dayton.

### ROAD TO CHIPOTLE NATIONALS

SPIRE finished the season ranked No. 5 overall in the SCNext Top 25 after racking up key wins over top teams like Southeastern Prep (Fla.), AZ Compass Prep (Ariz.), Faith Family (Texas), Sunrise Christian (Kan.) and Brewster Academy (N.H.), among others. SPIRE ranked No. 2 overall in the EYBL Scholastic in scoring defense, allowing just 57.2 points a game this season. They were also the No. 2 most efficient team in the league, draining 49.9 percent of their field goals and ranked No. 2 in assists at 14.6 a game.

# 9 ARCHBISHOP STEPINAC (NY)

## KNOW THE PERSONNEL

The Crusaders (26-4) are anchored by a trio of McDonald's All Americans: Jasiah Jervis and twin towers Adonis Ratliff and Darius Ratliff. Jervis, a 6-5 shooting guard who is signed to Michigan State, is a stat sheet filler and the Crusaders' leading scorer, averaging 17.4 points, 5.7 rebounds and 4.7 assists a game. Adonis, a 7-foot center who is signed to USC, anchors the paint on both ends of the floor, averaging 10.1 points and 5.4 rebounds a game, as does Darius, a 7-foot center who pumps in 13.3 points and 9.6 rebounds a game.
